The amended bylaw is one of several actions The City of Calgary is taking to support victims and deter the negative behaviour; making it clear that street harassment will not be tolerated in Calgary. Calgarians will now be able to report personally experienced or witnessed instances of street harassment in public spaces for investigation. An offence of the bylaw carries a fine of \$500. Efforts to increase public awareness are also underway, including an advertising campaign encouraging Calgarians to be aware of their own safety and the safety of others, this summer. Beginning June 1, 2022, incidents of street harassment can be reported through the Calgary Police Services non-emergency line at 403-</p>

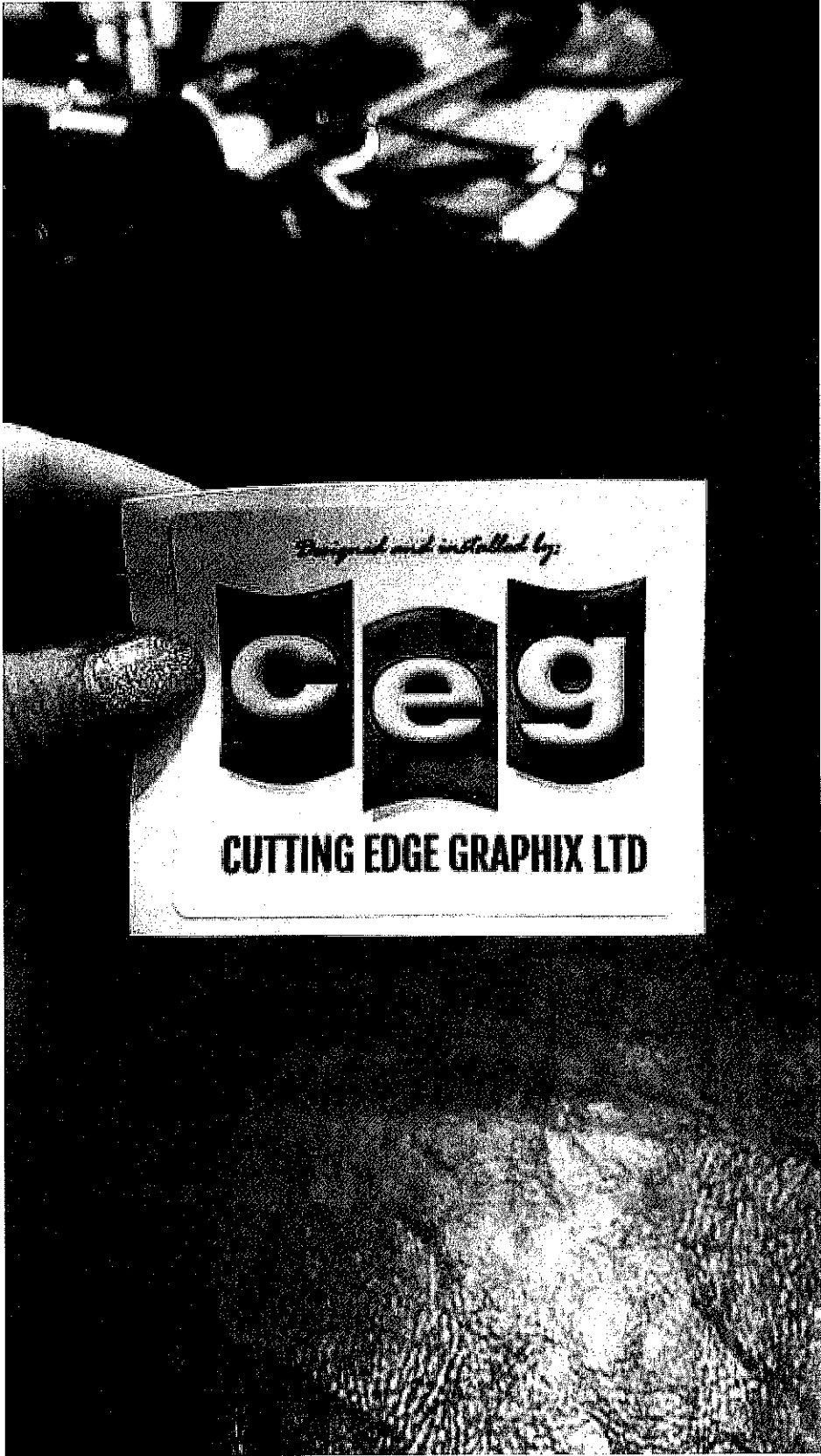

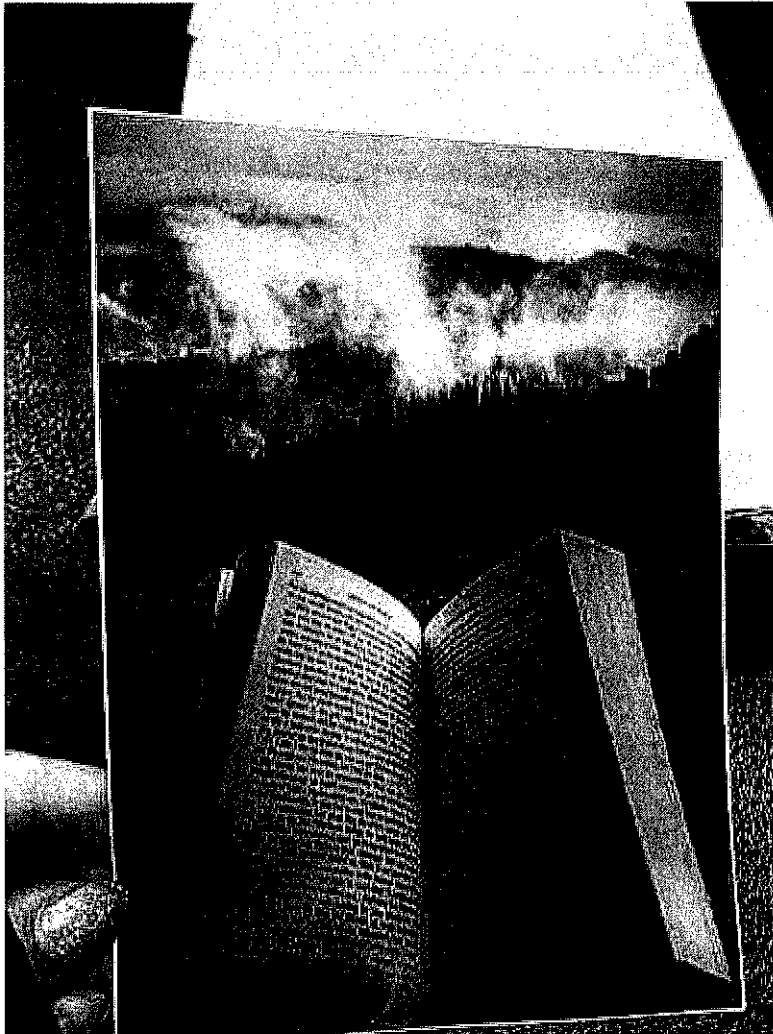



City of Calgary requires a familiarization period of 14 days on all new intrusion systems during which the monitoring station will respond to alarms by calling only the Service Location and Emergency Dispatch Contacts only. However, fire, medical, panic, and hold up alarms will be handled as if actual alarms

WARRANTY. Subject to the following exclusions and at no charge to the Subscriber, AE SECURITY will keep the Monitoring System in good working order for 12 months from the day the Monitoring System becomes operational. This includes providing the labour, parts and materials to adjust, repair and replace parts and materials installed by AE SECURITY. The exclusions are: (a) parts and materials not supplied by AE SECURITY; (b) damage caused by accident, act of God, Subscriber alteration or misuse; (c) operation disruption caused by interruption of electricity, telephone, cellular or internet service; (d) Subscriber not following the operating instructions for the Monitoring System supplied by AE SECURITY; (e) Component movement or settlement; (f) Battery replacement, if required.

MAINTENANCE. Following expiry of the 12-month warranty period, all AE SECURITY travel for and service, adjustments, repairs and replacements requested by the Subscriber will be paid by the Subscriber as charged by AE SECURITY. During the 12-month warranty period any required adjustment, repair or replacement arising from any exclusion stated in para. 6 above will be performed at the Subscriber's expense, including all travel by AE SECURITY for requested warranty or maintenance work outside Calgary city limits or outside normal AE SECURITY work hours.

CCTV SERVICES. The Subscriber acknowledges that AE Security and the Monitoring Station DO NOT monitor any CCTV system unless otherwise agreed in writing with the Subscriber. The Subscriber must test the CCTV system daily and immediately advise AE Security if the CCTV system is not operating properly. AE Security will not be liable if any event is not recorded due to any CCTV system malfunction.

You lose that right if you accept delivery after the 30 days. There are other grounds for extended cancellation. If you cancel this contract, the seller has 15 days to refund your money and any trade-in, or the cash value of the trade-in. You must then return the goods. To cancel, you must give notice of cancellation at the address in this contract. Nor can AE SECURITY guarantee that no damage or loss will occur.
