

GRAFFITI PREVENTION MEASURES

The best way to stop graffiti is to keep graffiti from happening.

BYLAWS

The following are some tips on how to protect you and your property from being victimized by graffiti:

- If you are installing a **fence** consider staggering the fence posts so there is not a smooth canvas for a vandal to write on.
- Use fences, rails and other barriers to discourage through traffic in areas where graffiti could be an
- Plant a **hedge**, this will give you privacy and doesn't leave a canvas for a graffiti vandal.
- Put in **shrubs**, clinging **plants** such as ivy, or plants with thorns to protect exposed walls. This will break up the writing space and make it harder for vandals to paint the wall.
- Trim trees or bushes that block the public's view of potential targets and vandals.





LIGHT

Install motion-detector lights at the rear of your property; this will make vandals feel exposed but not give them continuous light to work by and can prevent 'show casing' the graffiti.

PAINT

- Talk to your local **paint** store about applying a transparent coating to make graffiti removal easier.
- When painting, choose paint colours that are darker and keep leftover paint for touch-ups.

HOOD

- Keep your property in **good repair** and free of vandalism. Graffiti and other forms of vandalism left on properties are open invitations for more, not just on your property but on your neighbour's as well.
- If graffiti does appear on your property, try to remove it within 72 hours, this will significantly decrease the chance of it reoccurring.
- Encourage your neighbours to watch for and report graffiti vandals.
- Organize a community graffiti removal project. Bylaw services can help with this initiative, go to www.calgary.ca/animalservices click on Graffiti and Our Services for more information.



IF YOU SEE GRAFFITI IN YOUR COMMUNITY:

- If you see graffiti being applied, call 9-1-1.
- Record graffiti that you see in your community. Report the recorded information to 3–1–1.
- Remove the graffiti within 72 hours if it is on your property.





Commonly Observed Traffic Violations

A message from the Calgary Police Service.

With school season quickly approaching please keep in mind that the safety of the students and other drivers in this area is a priority for the Calgary Police Service. We receive concerns from community members and parents every fall about some dangerous driving behaviors around the schools as well in playground and school zones. Parents please assist your children in increasing their safety by using cross walk and crossing guards. Safety is everyone's responsibility.

School start and end times can make the roads very congested. To keep children safe, it is very important everyone obeys the law as defined in Alberta's Traffic Safety Act.

Commonly Observed Traffic Violations

- Illegal U-turn \$162 U -turns are illegal between intersections, alley junctions, when prohibited by sign, at traffic signals and when unsafe. The only place to legally do a U-turn is at an intersection not controlled by lights as long as it can be done safely and there is no sign indicating that you can't.
- Pedestrian J-walk \$81- If there is a marked crosswalk on the block, you MUST use it to cross. Please help to teach your children the proper way to cross the street and lead by example.

- Seatbelts! \$162 It is an offense to operate a
 vehicle without wearing a seatbelt or to have
 children not wearing a seatbelt. Please ensure
 your child seats are properly secured.
- Impede/block traffic (double parking) \$162 Double parking is stopping alongside another vehicle in the middle of a street to drop off your child. This adds to congestion because you are backing up traffic behind you while you let your child out of the vehicle. This also puts your child in a dangerous position as they will be walking between two cars parked after being let out. These vehicles are not expecting little ones to walk behind them and may back up into your child
- Distracted driving (use handheld cell phone, etc.) \$300 + 3 demerits!
- Disobey posted signs (includes no stopping zones) \$243
- Fail to yield for pedestrian in crosswalk \$810
- Unauthorized parking or stopping in handicap space \$300
- Stopping or parking in a bus zone \$81
- Parking in front of or within 1.5 meters of driveway/garage \$81
- Speeding \$110 for 10km/h over, \$175 for 20 km/h over. \$249 for 30 km/h over-

We ask that everyone is aware of the *school zones* in their areas and are keeping their eyes open for the students who are crossing the road and in the area. Safety is a primary concern and responsibility for everyone and the roll you play will help avoid expensive fines and serious injury should one of the students be struck by a motor vehicle.

Remember to choose safety over convenience.


