Online Zoom meeting

Meeting was called to Order at 7:05 pm

Approval of Agenda

Adoption of March 9th, 2020 general meetings Minutes: Ali M. accepted the minutes, Lois W. 2nd

Announcements:

- EWCA Hall is closed; all events and rentals cancelled to at least June 30th
- AGM – on hold till Hall re-opens most likely
- Community Garden planning can continue but we won't be planting until 2021

Reports to Board and related business:

1. *President's report* – Lori:

- Next Casino date will be moved back at least 6 months so this will affect our budget
- Vote needed to install Tammy A. as Secretary until AGM
 - Ali M motioned to install Tammy A. as Secretary until our AGM is held. Denise B. 2nd Motion passed – Welcome Tammy!
- Staffing considerations re: Toole Peet requirements for facility check-ins – EWCA should be eligible for the 75% Wage Subsidy program, so status quo for now
 - Charlene R. is moving out of Erin Woods. We will look at the Summer Student program to hire Damien to continue to cut the grass.
 - Lori L. is engaging in the virtual meetings with FCC on a continuous basis for updates and advocacy for the community centres.
 - The AGM being delayed should not be a concern for the residents due to the unprecedented circumstances of COVID 19.
 - Tammy A. can continue with the community garden planning; maybe trees can be planted in the fall.

2. *Treasurer* – Denise: – financials update – how many months of funding do we have at our current burn rate, and how will longer wait for Casino funds affect us? (Per FCC's request, Carolyn is tracking the costs to EWCA in lost revenues and extra expenses.)

- Our financials are looking okay for now. Will be good for 6-8 months

3. *Hall Manager* – Carolyn: - Need quotes on interior painting of Hall – wants to do ASAP
- Move up flooring replacement to be done after painting

- Carolyn will get a quote from Shaun B. for the interior painting of the hall and Denise B. will look at more painting trades on the facebook info page for the second quote.
4. *Special Events* – Ali: Neighbour Day June 20th – need ideas for a 'socially distant' event
- The Foresters grant was denied due to COVID 19. Can reapply after July.
 - The board will continue conversation for the Neighbour Day event
 - The TD grant has also been delayed until after April 30th.
5. *NPC* – Rob Dickinson: see reports sent out prior to meeting
- The new sign agreement with Calgary Parks will need to be signed.
 - The Enviro assessment for the Community Garden has been circulated
 - There will be no consequences from the City of Calgary for delay of AGM
 - The lawn chair theatre scheduled for August will be determined
 - The board brought up whether the City has protocol for little libraries or pantries during this time. Rob will investigate and send information.
 - The engineering consulting funding request needs a motion:

Anne M. motioned that a grant application be submitted to request funding for an Engineering Consultant to investigate the water pooling in the shed. Tammy A. 2nd the motion. Passed.

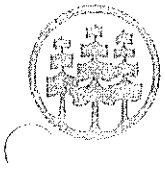

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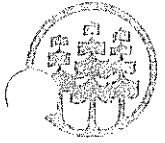

Announcements:

- Have not yet developed a COVID-19 policy, though may need to assess this, as we may need to cancel events. Will follow whatever AHS advises for events and gatherings.

Reports to Board and related business:

1. *CPS Community Resource Officer* – Constable Miguel Lay: February stats & trends **ABSENT**
2. *Safety* – Lois: Plans for 2020 CAT Walks **ABSENT**
 - No plans currently in place for 2020 CATWalks
 - This may also be affected by COVID-19 based on gathering advisement from AHS
3. *1st VP (Hall / Facilities)* – Lucky: **ABSENT**
4. *2nd VP (Sports)* – Anne: Soccer updates
 - Soccer:
 - first registration had 0 sign ups, second registration had 9 paid and 2 tentative
 - Carolyn will touch base with Peter on where to drop registrations
 - Do not need to pay for fields this year, and will assess where the soccer club is going
 - As 2nd VP (Sports) would like to change from a Sports focused role to an Events focused role. This is currently being assessed.
 - Carolyn's suggestion to ADD "Events" to the role instead of rewriting bylaws 2x
 - Right now the only sport falling under "Sports" is darts
 - No update from ECTAS, meeting being held next month
5. *East Calgary Twin Arena Society (ECTAS)* – Anne:
6. *Treasurer* – Denise: – financials update – plans for using up Casino funds
 - Financials

- Have money left over from last casino. Carolyn has written a request to keep \$20k aside to look at a new sign for the EWCA hall, for repainting the main hall as it is showing wear and tear, and to repaint the parking lot
 - All these are considered maintenance that may not be eligible
 - Possible grant (which was applied for by the school) that we may be able to access. Denise will investigate this.
 - Lori mentioned a work experience program for painting – EWCA supplies paint and a volunteer group completes the labour (currently being done at Southview) Rob will investigate this opportunity.
 - Anne will investigate the ECTAS work experience to identify any opportunities for labour/maintenance completion
- Denise and Carolyn to meet to set the budget for 2020

7. *Hall Manager – Carolyn:* - Need quotes on interior painting of Hall

- Repairs to eavestroughs done

- Painting

- Want to reach out to local painters (Denise's husband) Carolyn will prepare the exact requirements
- Line painting will be determined by Carolyn

- Additional Items

- \$308 in tips from the Casino
- There is (frozen) water in the shed again – not coming through the ceiling, the door, etc. but did seem to come in through the threshold by the lawnmower. This may be ground seepage.
 - Rob will take this back to the Capital team and assess if this is eligible for a consulting application to review the ground seepage. If so, we can work on a grant application with consulting costs 100% covered.
 - This is currently a safety hazard as there are no supplies or equipment that are being affected. Want to ensure this is addressed before the floor is damaged
- Lockbox inspections (outside) – there is a mandatory upgrade to Bluetooth smart lid. \$395+GST.
- The corners of the eavestroughs have been addressed – this was to correct the screws used in the eavestroughs previously.
- Carolyn provided a flooring sample. Will provide the installer a deposit in lieu of a PO, pending receiving approval and funds from the grant
 - Installation will take approx. 1-week and will take place Jul/Aug, to be booked by Carolyn once deposit is made

8. *Director-at-Large – Tammy:* Is now Garden Cmte Chair © / Appl. sent for TD Parks Grant

9. *Special Events – Ali:* Per above - working w. Tammy on TD Parks Grant event planning

- Next event is Neighbours Day – when hearing back on the TD grant, she will then apply for the Forresters Grant to begin preparation.
 - If grant is approved, we will look at having games in the park, and educate the community on recycling, gardens, etc.
 - Lois will provide Ali possible resources with Green Calgary for attending on Neighbour Day, as will Tammy

- Possible educator from Honey Meadows Farms, and Rob may have resources for honey bee educators as well (coordinate with the pollinator event)
 - For the Pollinator Plant Exchange we are looking to add this to the Neighbour Day as well to continue promoting green spaces in our community and the community garden
10. *Seniors Events – Amtul: March Senior Tea updates* **ABSENT**
- Lori provided update: Tea is going ahead, though may be light on attendance (generally 30-40 attend from communities all across Calgary)
11. *Bingo – Shannon C: Drove in from Lethbridge to attend CCSBA AGM* **ABSENT**
- Backbone for our casino account, and hugely appreciated for attending the meeting
12. *NPC – Rob Dickinson: see reports sent out prior to meeting (TAMMY JUST INCLUDE ROB'S REPORT IN THE MINUTES)*
- Still waiting on the enviro review from STANTEC, which will identify if we are able to plant fruit trees in the green space/garden. This is done between City Parks + Stantec, and will be shared with us for community garden planning. Being reviewed by City of Calgary, and will be provided to us shortly
 - CCG Application for flooring is submitted, and awaiting a response
 - Community Cleanliness Initiatives are on hold due to capacity – advise Rob should any like to participate in this
 - Could possibly be piggybacked onto Community Cleanup, Garden, Lawnchair Theatre
 - If there is interest outside the board then get this running
 - TD Grant submitted, response early April
 - Community Garden up and running
 - Got the cleanup! Sept 26!
 - Ward Boundaries
 - Encouraged to double check and provide comments
 - Currently based on population levels and shifted minor changes from Ward 11 boundary (second option had a large shift – adds Riverbend + Quarry Park)
 - Engage Portal is up
 - No confirmed date for Lawnchair Theatre
 - Community Garden Event Tomorrow
 - Tammy will include in the garden group to assess interest / attendees
13. *President's report – Lori: Succession planning / AGM / Meet-the-Board event @ April 13th*
Board meeting w/ 6:30 early start – Board to build slate for AGM
- Meeting next month will start at 6:30 (Easter Monday) and will build our slate for the AGM
 - Identify open positions and advertise in the weeks prior to the AGM (May 11)
 - People we know, neighbours, members of committees, etc.
 - Denise will not be here for the April meeting
 - Lori's position is up, Anne's position is up

Lori Peterson

- Completing garage sales each year and people ask about the newsletters regularly
 - A lot of people in the community who aren't on FB or computers who are feeling very disconnected
 - Did up a survey on FB and emailed it to the garage sale email list asking if a ~~monthly newsletter was warranted~~

- o 12CSI newsletter was not on their radar
- o Lori wants to use the newsletter to draw attention to this that
- o Carolyn: when we had a monthly newsletter we were still disengaged – Canada Post costs \$300 to deliver
- o 12CSI – 2019/2020 year we paid \$2300 for a quarterly newsletter, professionally done, information for the whole area. Started this mid-2018 (\$1725 in 2018)
 - Stapleton (10/year) 2017/2018 year was \$4100 which included all costs (mailing, supplies)
 - 2016/2017 was \$4063
- o Lori doesn't want to get rid of CSI, just wants to challenge the ideas

ENMAX Energizing Spaces Fund Postponed

In cooperation with our partner, ENMAX, we have decided to postpone awarding the ENMAX Energizing Spaces grant for the spring cycle. We recognize that during a state of emergency this is not the best time for folks to be filling out applications or monitoring deadlines, etc. That said, ENMAX is very committed to supporting our members through Energizing Spaces. **We will keep you updated when more information is available on future applications** and we apologize for any inconvenience this may have caused. We have reached out to those who applied for this round, and will be in contact with them as well when more information is available.

ActivateYYC 3.0 Postponed

As you might imagine, with social distancing and the current state of emergency, ActivateYYC Traffic Calming can't proceed as planned this summer. The City staff who are required to "install" the posts at the intersections are seconded for the state of emergency and without being able to gather to "activate" the traffic bump outs (we aren't sure when we can gather as large groups); we felt it was prudent to postpone this project until the spring of 2021. While we are disappointed, we have been assured we can resume next year. While delayed, we are optimistic that we will still be able to have ActivateYYC Traffic Calming in the future. If your organization has already applied for ActivateYYC Traffic Calming, there is no need to reapply next year. We will reach out early next year to see if you would like your application to proceed—and will only require an update on dates and contacts.

PUBLIC INPUT ON APPLICATIONS REMAINS A PRIORITY

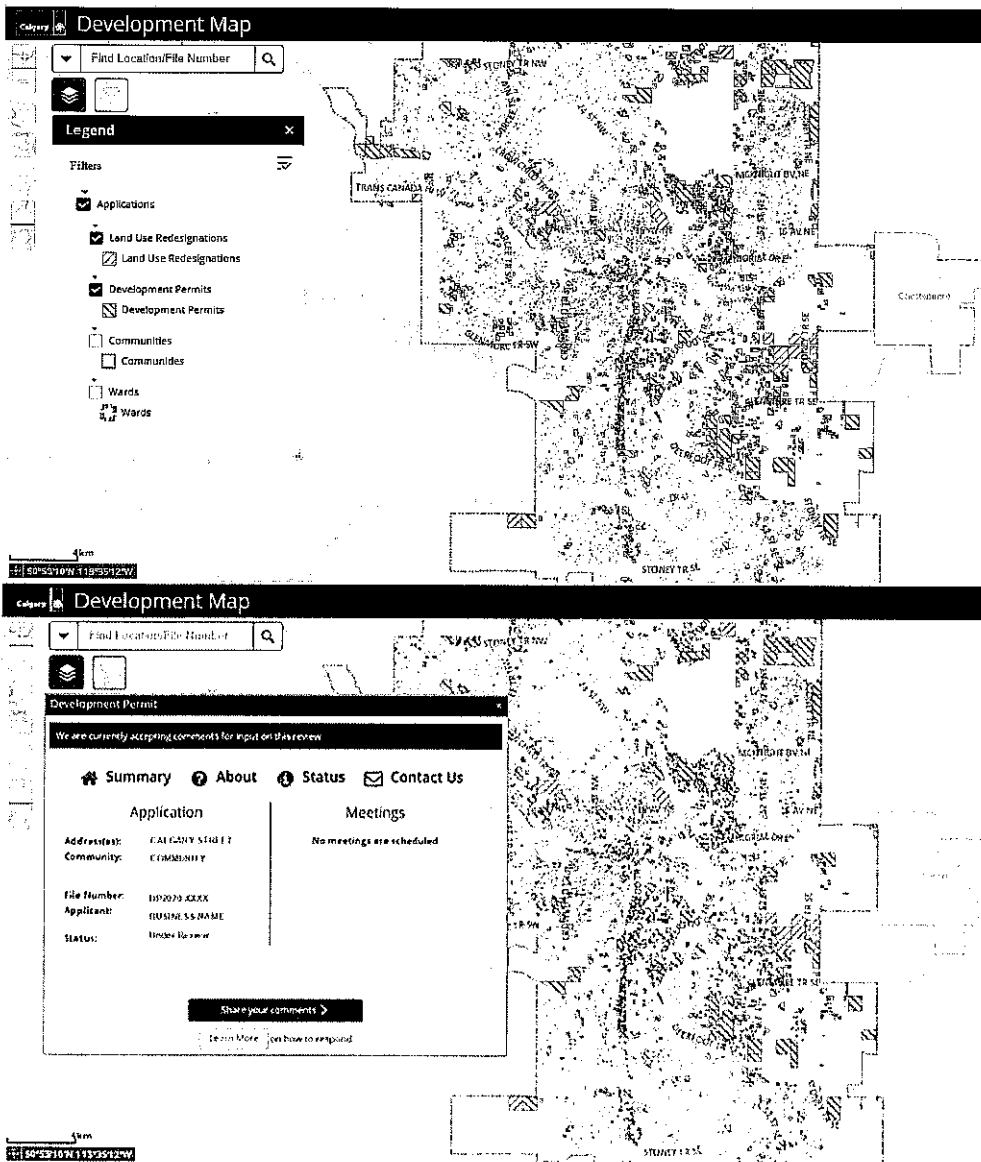
KEY MESSAGING

We also continue working on improvements to the map, along with our current focus on adapting the tool to users' changing needs.





AGLC – Use of Proceeds

The AGLC has released an update regarding Use of Proceed allowances for casino funds. The full Q&A can be found here: https://aglc.ca/sites/aglc.ca/files/aglc_files/QA%20-%20Use%20of%20Proceeds_23March2020.pdf

The main updates many groups may be interested in include:

- Facility - Groups may now use 100% for operating expenses on the facility, compared to 50% in the past
- Wages/Salaries - Gaming proceeds can be used on wages/salaries that provide charitable services
- Emergency Assistance – proceeds can be used to assist individuals who are facing dire or serious circumstances

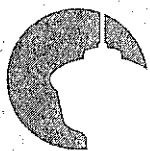
