- 1. CPS Community Resource Office Constable Miguel Lay: May Stats & Trends
 - a. Lori heard from Miguel prior to board meeting there was a letter circulated to 10 communities. A Service Optimization Review being conducted. Lori will send around. [CPS COMMUNITY STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT]
 - b. There has been an increase in marked and unmarked patrols in the trailer area in addition, Lori sent email to contact at city in an effort to have a "No U-Turn" or "Dead End" sign placed at the entrance.
 - c. <u>Crime Trends</u> only trend we are seeing right now is the theft OF and FROM vehicles, though has been decreasing in the last month (stats from April)
- 2. Safety Lois
 - a. 12CSI + Environmental Design Tactics was quite an involved program and Lois/Lori didn't see the benefit for us as residents/a community, nor would those involved have the time available to engage.
 - i. 2.5 hour Zoom meeting on a weekly basis from June 18 Aug 17
 - ii. Lois has been discussing with Lori and it was determined this is of no benefit to the EW community at this time
 - iii. Do not have a core group who have been engaged in CATwalks that could commit/be involved
- 3. 1st VP (Hall/Facilities) Lucky
 - a. Lucky was not in attendance, though Carolyn confirmed there is no need at the hall currently
- 4. 2nd VP (Sports) Anne
 - a. No items for discussion at this time



- 5. East Calgary Twin Arena Society (ECTAS) Anne
 - a. Next meeting is June 16, 2020. There have been a number of topics for discussion but no move forward action until arenas can reopen in September.
 - b. CEWS has been utilized for the ECTAS staff, and renovations have started. ECTAS has also applied for and received the CEBA.
 - Note regarding the repayment of the CEBA: as shareholders and directors for ECTAS we (EW) may be held liable for the repayment of these funds (by Dec 31, 2022)
 - c. ECTAS missed a Bingo due to COVID-19.
 - d. There has been some discussion on protocols in place for reopening of the arena, including additional arena improvements (automatic doors, etc.)
- 6. Treasurer Denise
 - i. Balance Sheet

 - b. Revenue is quite a bit lower than it was, however expenses have been cut.
 - c. Have received draft of 2019 financials, and Carolyn and Denise are reviewing with Nancy on Wednesday.

 - o Goal is 8-10 core members. Challenge is both COVID and starting fresh.
 - Tammy to set up a bi-weekly meeting to keep momentum going

Reports to Board and related business:

- 1. CPS Community Resource Office Constable Miguel Lay: April Stats & Trends
 - a. Reached out to him to get help for Ali's neck of the woods. Said he would set up more patrols. They have seen an increase in patrols.
 - b. There was an incident in the last week for smashed vehicles and a vehicular incident in the park. Issues with graffiti, but also the community helping to clean it up.
 - c. There is awareness that they need to be calling the non-emergency line. They are ok monitoring their own park.
 - d. Lois is this something they can be empowered to do on their own?
 - e. Lori will look into having a "NO ENTER/NO EXIT" sign put in place
 - f. Many homeless are not welcome at the centres and shelters w/ rules and guidelines, and homeless camps are on the rise. They do not expect answers quickly can tell them to vacate the private premises, but they vacate to other locations. There is no legal location to displace them to, and there's hope the city and/or province will hopefully give direction soon.



- g. Any ideas on a cohesive policy call the non-emerg line.
- 2. Safety nothing else further than the above, aside from reaching out to Theresa
 - a. Look at bylaw as an additional resource Shylene has been around a bit more and has been a resource. They are strapped and dealing with a lot of other issues they do not deal with on another basis.
 - b. Possibly invite someone from Jian Carlo's office and Lois will reach out to Larry
- 3. 1st VP (Hall/Facilities) Lucky n/a
- 4. 2nd VP (Sports) Anne same as last month. Have another meeting on May 19 to update where they're going. Everything closed. They were applying for the CEWS for Jon (Operations Manager) and Carol (financial manager) as the only two people left working there. Still incurring \$8k/mo in fees
 - a. Arenas may or may not be receiving relief from the city. Not sure what can/cannot be done right now for hockey. This will depend on who is operating areas i.e. community associations receiving funding report vs. ECTAS not being under this scope. Rob will take this question back to the City to see if he can circulate information on this.
- 5. East Calgary Twin Arena Society (ECTAS) Anne
- 6. Treasurer Denise: financials update
 - a. Carolyn sent financials today (attached) not reviewing line by line.
 - b. Has worked on the cashflow with Rob would like to see things up and running sooner rather than later (preschools and churches)
 - c. Carolyn received confirmation to use casino money on expenses as needed, as well as receiving clarification on when/how to be used.
 - d. Tammy and Carolyn to work together to work with Carolyn to hire for grounds work.
- 7. Hall Manager Carolyn
 - a. The grant that Rob has circulated has been submitted. Wait to see the grant approval prior to booking a painter for the hall
 - b. Intake until Jun 15 unsure as to when decision are made. Rolling or after the cutoff.




