## Residential Traffic Safety Unit

Over the last three years the Calgary Police Service has developed a new unit to specifically address Residential Traffic Safety. This unit has been presenting to each Ward in the City to both provide and to solicit information on “problem areas” throughout the City to allow more specific and targeted visibility and enforcement. This unit is specifically interested in Residential TRAFFIC issues. The strategy has been:

- Utilize citizen feedback to inform operational response
- Focus on playground zones, pedestrian rich locations and other high risk locations identified through collision data analysis
- Emphasize public awareness and education, and facilitate citizen engagement through Ward Traffic Safety Meetings and to work with City partners to further support traffic calming measures outside enforcement

One of the key tools to help Calgary Police Service monitor and track these issues is the Traffic Service Request (TSR).

### **Operation Cold Start**

Operation Cold Start is a crime prevention initiative that was started in December 2016 to address the high number of vehicles that are left running in our city. As part of the operation, officers patrol communities looking for vehicles that are easy targets for thieves because they are left running and unattended. When officers find these easy targets, they take the opportunity to educate the driver about how quickly how vehicle can be stolen and how dangerous their car could become in the hands of a criminal.

Auto theft offenders routinely engage in high-risk criminal driving behaviour, have little regard for the safety of Calgarians, and do not care if a vehicle becomes damaged or involved in a collision. More than 41 per cent of all stolen vehicles that have been recovered in 2019 were reported to be damaged or involved in a collision.

This year Operation Cold start was conducted January 13<sup>th</sup> – 17<sup>th</sup>, 2020, Monday – Friday, between 5am – 10 am. There were **430** cars found running with the keys in the ignition. During this period **33** cars were stolen while being warmed up.

This is the fourth year the operation has been running. We have seen improvement in our communities with many more individuals using remote starters during the winter. But we continue to ask Calgarians to assist us in reducing these numbers by using remote car starters or just staying with their vehicles while it warms up. As there will be many more cold mornings to come this winter, we hope that Calgarians will be more aware that it could happen to them, regardless where they live in the city.

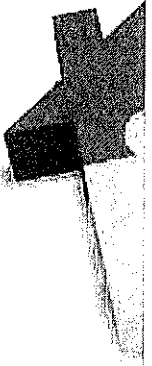

## Campaign | 9 p.m. Routine

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### Background

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The *9 p.m. Routine* is a social media campaign that was started by the Pasco County Sheriff's Office in Florida in 2016. The campaign aims to remind citizens to avoid becoming the victim of preventable crime by securing their houses and vehicles before they go to bed.

The Calgary Police Service is encouraging citizens to complete the *9 p.m. Routine* through a social media campaign using the established #9PMRoutine hashtag. Social media posts will be scheduled in the evenings leading up to 9 p.m. on the Service's Twitter, Facebook and Instagram pages to remind citizens to complete the routine.

The routine includes:

1. Removing valuables from vehicles.
2. Ensuring vehicles are locked, windows are closed and if possible parked in a garage.
3. Closing garage doors and windows.
4. Locking any person-doors in the garage, including those leading into a house.
5. Checking that all house doors – front, back, side and garage – are locked.
6. Ensuring all windows are shut.
7. Turning on an exterior light.

### Key Messages

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- Property crimes are often crimes of opportunity, there are many easy things that citizens can do to protect themselves.
- Citizens are encouraged to incorporate the *9 p.m. Routine* into their current nightly routine, so it becomes a habit.
- 50% of break and enters happen overnight and occur in all areas of the city – they are not isolated to one neighbourhood. It's important that all citizens remain vigilant and establish a routine to protect themselves.

### Key Stats

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- A residential break and enter occurs roughly every 2.5 hours in Calgary.
- 50% of break ins occur between 9 am and 6 pm
- 40% of break ins occur via an unlocked door, window or garage
- Offenders have to force entry in only 16% of break ins

### **Have you started your 9 p.m. Routine?**

Did you know approximately 50 percent of break and enters occur in Calgary between 9 p.m. and 6 a.m.? More than 44 percent of break and enters are preventable by simply removing valuables from cars, always locking vehicles and being mindful of who may be entering a parkade or building after you.

In order to help keep parkades and residential buildings throughout the downtown and surrounding area in Calgary, the Calgary Police Service (CPS) is reminding citizens to ensure that their vehicles, parkades and residential building entries and exits are always secured, especially before going to bed. The 9 p.m. Routine serves as reminder for Calgarians to do just that.

Every night at 9 p.m., you are encouraged to:

- Remove all valuables from vehicles, including personal documents, key fobs, GPS units, mail, sports equipment and electronic devices.
- Ensure that vehicles are locked, windows are closed and if possible, parked in a secure parkade.
- Watch for vehicles or people trying to quickly enter a parkade, or residential lobby entrance, directly after you. This means refraining from holding the door open for people you don't know.
- Don't share alarm codes, pass keys or security cards. Even letting a friend or family member borrow these items can potentially create security concerns. If these items are ever lost or stolen, it could mean easy access for unwanted guests.
- Look for surveillance cameras. If possible, try to park in well-lit areas that are in view of building security cameras.
- Report suspicious behaviour. CPS encourages citizens to report suspicious behaviour by calling the non-emergency line at 403-266-1234. For crimes in progress, call 9-1-1.

By creating a routine before going to bed, you can help protect and ensure the security of you and your neighbour's vehicles and residential building complexes. CPS is helping to spread the word to neighbours, building and property managers and board members.

## Storm Ponds

**Storm ponds are not intended for recreational use. The water in storm ponds is constantly flowing with fluctuating water levels and contains pollutants. For the health and safety of the public several activities are prohibited, including swimming, skating, boating, fishing and fish stocking.**

Storm Ponds are natural looking man-made facilities designed to collect runoff following either a rainfall or snowmelt event.

Besides helping to mitigate local flooding, the 200 plus ponds that The City currently operates and maintains, improves the quality of water that eventually reaches the rivers.

Storm ponds or wet ponds collect water and run-off from the storm water system, trapping sediment and pollutants such as oils and chemicals from driveways and roadways, fertilizer, pesticides, and sediments and debris from roads and underdeveloped areas, helping return cleaner water to rivers and streams. These ponds are a vital part of Calgary's storm water system.
